**HANCOCK COUNTY LEADS IN OIL**

(By Associated Press to The Banner)  
FINDLAY, O., June 11.—With 10 new wells which made 176 barrels in initial output for May, Hancock county leads oil fields of the state again, according to reports here.

The field has 28 new wells, which produced 409 barrels the first 24 hours. In April, there were 49 new wells, with an output of 531 barrels.

New work is increasing, despite the decrease in the price of crude oil. Eighty rigs up and drilling were reported at the end of the month.
