TERMS OF ADMISSION.

No person will be admitted a member of the Freshman class, unless he shall have completed his fourteenth year; nor a higher class without a proportioned increase of age.

Every candidate for admission must produce a certificate of good moral character.—He must be acquainted with English Grammar, Arithmetic and Geography, and be able to read, construe and parse the following books:—Jacob's Latin Reader, Sallust, Cicero, Virgil, and Jacobs' Greek Reader, and be acquainted with Latin and Greek Prosody: He must also pay into the College Treasury the regular bill for one year.

A Student wishing to enter an advanced class, must undergo an examination in the studies which have been pursued by the class, or studies equivalent to them.

No Student shall be considered entitled to a regular dismission unless he be able to present a certificate from the Treasurer that his college bills are paid.

LECTURES.—A course of written Lectures is delivered, on select subjects in Natural Philosophy and Astronomy, by the Prof. of Math. and Nat. Phil. to the Senior Class.

A course of experimental Lectures by the Prof. of Math. and Nat. Phil. to the Junior Class.

A course of Chemical Lectures, by the Prof. of Chemistry, to the Junior Class.

A course of Mineralogical and Geological Lectures by the Professor of Chemistry, &c., to the Senior Class.

During the whole College Course, a portion of the Greek Testament on Monday mornings; Religious exercises and Bible recitations on Wednesday afternoons; frequent exercises in Composition and Declamation.

Persons not candidates for a degree, can attend to any branch of the College course, in connexion with the class attending to that branch at the time: The charge to them will be the same as to the members of the class.

No Student, a member of a class, may deviate from the prescribed course of studies and thereby become irregular, without the written request of his parent or guardian and the approbation of the Faculty.

There are two public examinations—one at the close of each session: At these examinations, the Students are examined in all the studies of the past session in such a thorough and exact manner, as to exhibit, as far

as possible, to the Trustees and friends of the Institution, the acquirements of each individual.

SESSIONS AND VACATIONS.

The year is divided into two sessions, each consisting of twenty weeks. The first begins eight weeks after Commencement, which is on the first Wednesday of September. There is a vacation of four weeks between the two sessions.

EXPENSES.

For forty weeks term time, including board, tuition, room-rent, fuel and light, for a *Theological Student*, Fifty Dollars: For a *College Student*, Seventy Dollars.

N. B. These expenses to be paid in all cases, in advance. Incidental expenses to be paid at the end of each term. If Students remain during vacation, their expenses will be increased in the same proportion, and they will be subject to the same rules of order, as in term time.

If any Student leave on account of sickness, or for any other reason be dismissed, the balance due him will be refunded.

Necessary articles of clothing, and books used in the Institution can usually be procured at the College Store. It is desired that parents and guardians may be explicit in stating the kind and amount of expenses which they wish their sons and wards to incur.

ROOMS.

The Students all room in the College buildings, and board at the College table.

RELIGIOUS EXERCISES.

Every Student is required to be present at morning and evening prayers in the Chapel—to attend every exercise of public worship regularly on the Lord's Day, and on such other days as may, by public authority be appointed for religious observance—and at all

times, to show respect to the ordinances of religion.—
In case the parent or guardian shall request, in writing,
that his son or ward attend the worship of any other
denomination, he is permitted to do so.

LIBRARY.

Students over 15 years of age have access to the College Library, (which contains upwards of 2,300 volumes,) the same as members of College. The Library is open once a week for receiving and returning books.

VACATIONS

In the Grammar-School occur at the same time with those of the College.

EXPENSES.

For board, tuition, fuel, light and room-rent, for forty weeks' term-time, *Sixty Dollars*, payable in advance.

Monies for necessary incidental expenses, parents are recommended to deposit with the Treasurer, or with some friend, with explicit directions as to the manner of their expenditure. In no case will pocket money be furnished to a Student, unless a deposit for that purpose has been made.

The younger Students are permitted to purchase nothing without an order from their immediate instructor.

Payments to be made to Rev. M. T. C. WING, Treasurer, directly, or by certificates of deposit in approved Banks.
