The matter was laid before the commissioners by L. C. Walker, president of the farm bureau, John Cunningham, O. E. Anderson, J. Berg and L. G. Mayer. The committee also presented a petition by 329 members of the bureau, with the statement that there are many names to be added to it, in support of the appropriation.

It is not thought that the commissioners will fail to take due view of the request after they have satisfied themselves of the wisdom of the plan. One member of the committee said Monday that he believed all of the commissioners would be in favor of the farm bureau. He held the opinion that the action Monday merely to consider the merits of the plan, and not the expenditure of the people's money.

At the meeting Monday afternoon it was learned that the total cost of the farm bureau in this county is about three cents per \$1.00 of property on the tax duplicate. This shows the ridiculously small amount for the individual.

The commissioners will act upon the petition at their next meeting Monday.
