# CASUALTY LIST

(Official War Department Report)

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4—The cas-  
ualty list issued by the war depart-  
ment today contained 627 names, di-  
vided as follows: Killed in action  
161, died of wounds 77, died of acci-  
dent and other causes 3, died from  
airplane accident 1, died of disease  
100, wounded severely 65, wounded,  
degree undetermined, 71, wounded  
slightly 133, missing in action 16.
