## FILE THE FIRST CASE

Under The Torrens Law In  
In Knox County Court

The Action Brought By An  
Assignee In Probate

The Last Will Of Bertha C.  
Payne Is Filed

Delinquent Tax List Will Not  
Be Large

Verdict Set Aside In Case By  
Judge Jewell

The first suit under the Torrens law in Knox county was filed Tues- day afternoon in the probate court. The case was that of Robert L. Carr, assignee of E. J. Hayes et al., the firm being known as Hayes Brothers vs. The Gleeny Glass Company. The suit is filed by the assignee for the creditors to register title and to sell lands. As this is the first case of the kind to be filed in the county under the Torrens law it will be watched with much interest. The date of the hearing has not yet been set down by Probate Judge Wilkins.

### The Payne Will—

The last will and testament of Bertha C. Payne, late of Mt. Vernon, has been filed in probate. By the terms of the will she gives to her son, Ken- neth Payne, her piano and all her right, and interest in the homestead property on Ann street. The same is to be held in trust and Harrison Judy is named as the trustee. The trustee may sell the piano, rent or sell the real estate, the income of
