## NEWS HEADLINES

(Washington) -- President Nixon today charged Hanoi with broadening the Vietnam war into an Indochina conflict and predicted the United States and its allies will have more hard choices in combatting possible new enemy thrusts in South Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos.

(Washington) -- Additional thousands of South Vietnamese troops may be sent into Laos in the coming weeks before the U.S.-backed drive against enemy supply routes is ended, say Pentagon sources.

(Ft. Benning, Ga.) -- After two days on the witness stand, Lt. William L. Calley, Jr. has left unanswered two major questions: How many civilians were killed at My Lai? How many did he kill?
