Dear Brother

I suppose, ere this, you've rec<sup>d</sup> the "Circular subscription" for the Church-man's Magazine to be printed in a new Series at Elizabeth N. Jamieson & edited by the Rev John C. Kudd.

Should any doubts arise on acct. of the difficulty of conveying them to the subscribers; perhaps they may be obviated by informing you that whatever numbers shall be taken up this River may be sent to this place; and hence conveyed by the stage, or by the Boats as shall be thought best without any material expence.
