My dear Whilander

The Rev. Mr. Cranston, the Rector
of this Parish this moment called: and being on the
wing for Boston by the stage in the morning I
have but one moment to write you, while he
is amusing himself in my study.

I rec^d your letter of the 29th inst. and sat-
isfying agreeably to its import have this day
sent to Mr. Kinley for mail \$50, to be applied to
your benefit. Your disposition to economize
all you can consistently with honor and com-
fort I well know, and therefore rest easy.

The bill is what I did not expect, but must sub-
mit - hoping all things are right tho' I can't see
it.

I wish you rather to perfect yourself
in the languages you have commenced than
to commence any new ones. Hebrew you
must study - The acquisition thereof is what
kept me in a great degree firm to the purpose
of sending you to Cambridge

I heard from George this day - he is well and man-
-tains you with much love. The Little spoiled
Boy continues to win on our affections: but never
do I press him to my fond bosom without pray-
ing our heavenly Father to bless his loved Pro-
-gen.

Don't forget to be very respectful & civil to the
worthy Gentlemen who will hand you this. He
is well acquainted with all the folks at Court
and will introduce you to those who are worthy
of your confidence.

Mr. Sador has lost his Mother full of days & is
rich in good fruits. Mrs. Pigouney is quite ill
I pray God her sickness may not prove fatal.
- Other news we have none.

All send love, and none more
ardently prays that you may be kept from
