The attorney for Branch, Mr. H. E. Slapp, expects to take the case to the court of appeals and when that court convenes Tuesday will apply for a stay of execution. Prior to his sentence, Branch stated to the court that he was 28 years of age and had served a term in the Ohio penitentiary for shooting. His record also shows that he had also served two terms for horse stealing.</p>	<h2>WILLARD</h2> <h3>Knocks Johnson Out In 26th Round</h3> <h3>And Becomes The Heavy Weight Champion</h3> <p>Havana, April 5.—In the 26th round Jack Johnson went down before Jess Willard and took the count. The crowd went wild over the achievement of the Kansas boy, the new heavy-weight champion of the world.</p> <p>Havana, April 5.—The day for the 14th fight between Jack Johnson and Jess Willard dawned cloudy and cold, but this did not interfere with the great mass of spectators present to witness the fight.</p> <p>The battle started at 11 o'clock. In the first eight rounds everything seemed to be in Johnson's favor. Willard was nervous and boxed like an amateur in the first 6 rounds. In the sixth, seventh and eighth rounds Willard picked up to a great extent and landed many blows on Johnson's face.</p> <p>22 round—knocks were even.</p>	<h2>BAPTIZED</h2> <h3>Under Chilly Waters Of The Kokosing River</h3> <h3>Sixteen Colored People Received Into Church, Sunday</h3> <p>Nearly 400 people gathered at the West High street bridge Sunday afternoon to witness the unusual spectacle of a public baptism of colored people in the waters of the Kokosing.</p> <p>The ceremony was performed by Elder Grayson of the Calvary Baptist church. Intrepidly, he waded out into the river until the water was up to his shoulders and there received the various postulants. There were 16 in all, 8 of each sex.</p> <p>All were submerged completely and the icy waters caused two of the women to faint. They were hoisted into carriages after the ceremony and hastily driven to their homes, as were the others who were not thus affected.</p> <p>There will be another baptismal ceremony on April 18, at which time five more people will be submerged.
