### Commissioners Order A New Bidding On Office Steel Work

Six hundred and nineteen thousand, one hundred and seventy-four dollars and ninety-four cents is the aggregate amount of taxes charged on property in Knox county, according to the annual statement of Auditor Walter M. Riley.

Of this \$21,834.57 goes to the state and \$582,598.85 goes to the townships and county.

Some very interesting items are the tax on the 331,987 acres of land the value of the 331,987 acres of land in the county amounts to \$294,344.29, while the tax on real estate in cities and incorporated villages aggregates \$97,933.69.

The tax on personal property, outside of cities and villages, is \$133,160, while that in the cities and villages is \$522,842.80.

Accordingly, the total tax on all property in the county is \$485,221.69.

The total taxes for the villages of the county and the city of Mt. Vernon is as follows:

- Gambier—\$1,241.28.
- Martinsburg—\$638.91.
- Centerburg—\$5,002.77.
- Fredericktown (Morris)—\$452.
- Danville—\$1,797.88.
- Buckeye City—\$1,142.82.
- Hrinksaven—\$479.45.

- Mt. Vernon (Clinton)—\$51,527.80.

The report shows that delinquencies amounted to \$4,310.76. Delinquent taxes of 1915 and former years on personal property amount to \$3,923.16.
