Hartford March 17th 1817

Dear George

I arrived here last evening a little after 12 o'clock - had a very easy & pleasant ride, considering that it was so late in the night. The stage for Windsor & Harrow was gone; and, as you predicted, I shall be obliged to suspend my homeward march till Thursday next. I learn that there is no communication from Worcester to Keene by Stage; of course it would be inadvisable to take the latter place & Sutton in my way to Vermont.

I this morning called on your folks, - they live with Mr Adams, and are all in good health. Sheldon & Cyrus board with your mother. Your Father has been gone a fortnight to day, - and has not been heard from since his departure. He proposed to take Buffalo and Albany in his way to Ohio, or rather, to the Westward, being wholly undetermined in what part of those extensive regions he should make his pitch. A letter is expected from him on Saturday next.

I have conversed upon the French - New York plan with your Mother - she approves of the object but hints about the means - She will write to you & explain her views on the propriety of the measure.

Cyrus is still here and in an unsettled condition, but excellent hopes & spirits.

Why have I troubled you with this letter?
Your good rep. & love must furnish favorable reply.
