Dear George

I arrived here on Friday 11 A.M. & found a letter from Judge Beckett, (who had on Wednesday adjourned the Court till Friday Morning) <sup>at home</sup> informing me that he could no further proceed with the business of the Court. I accordingly immediately repaired to the Court house, and disposed of three jury trials before dinner, in the evening of two more came yesterday of five. Tho' there are about 40 trials yet on the docket. I am in some hopes of finishing the business in the course of next week & the Monday after.

I shall write you again when at Burlington, and tell you that when on my way home, I saw an Officer of the line, a Capt. Clark, son of Old Kifle, who informed me that he was well acquainted with Lieut. Taylor, the Gentleman who borrowed cash of me at Dr. Galt; that he had often heard Taylor mention me, and of his acquaintance with me at Dr. Galt. Jay has lately had a duel with Messrs. M<sup>r</sup>. Gleylin exchanged two shots, & wounded M<sup>r</sup>. Gleylin twice, tho' not dangerously.
