PETIT JURY IS EXCUSED BY THE COURT TUESDAY

Jurors May Be Called Back, However, To Hear Other Cases Pending

Following the verdict of the petit jury in the Willis-Lee case Tuesday, the jurors were excused by the court until called. It is probable that the petit jury will be called, however, within a few days to hear several other cases now pending in the common pleas court.

Adjudged Insane—

Henry Mavis was adjudged insane by the probate court Tuesday and ordered committed to the state hospital for insane at Columbus. The unfortunate man is 59 years of age and lived on a farm in Pleasant township. The affidavit in lunacy was filed against him by his wife, Ellen Mavis. The examining physicians reported that Mavis suffers from a number of mild hallucinations.

Loney Bound Over—

A transcript of the proceedings in the court of Squire J. P. Blubaugh at Danville in the matter of the State of Ohio vs Darwin D. Loney, charged with assault and battery, has been filed in the common pleas court. Loney was arrested following the filing of an affidavit against him by J. P. Dodd. When arraigned before Justice Blubaugh, he pleaded not guilty, waived examination and was bound over to the common pleas court to await the action of the grand jury. The defendant furnished \$100 bond with Judson Loney as surety.

BATTERY E WILL BE INSPECTED BY MAJOR WALLACE

U. S. Army Officer To Be In City On Saturday Evening

TRUCK-DRIVERS AND MECHANICS SOUGHT

Attractive Opening For Men Of These Abilities; Recruiting Lively

Federal inspection of Battery E of this county will be made Saturday evening, July 7, on the public square of Mt. Vernon, according to word received Thursday by First Lieut. Julius W. Headington.

The inspecting officer will be Major William Wallace of the United States army and will start promptly at 7:30 o'clock. Attendance by battery members at this time is absolutely compulsory.

To prepare for the inspection and learn the necessary formation, there will be a drill of the battery Friday night at 7:30. All men must attend this drill.

There is an opening, states Lieut. Headington, for truck-drivers and mechanics for the ammunition and supply trains of the battalion. Men who enter this branch of the service will be attached to Battery E and will sleep and bunk with their friends. They will be located in the battery camp, but two battery streets from Battery E men.

Recruiting here is proceeding in a lively fashion, although last Saturday was the official closing time.

The battery tent was a center for Fourth of July celebrations Wednesday. Men were grouped around it all day and evening.
