Wanamaker-Fox Wedding

Mr. Walter B. Wanamaker, assistant prosecuting attorney of Summit county, son of Judge and Mrs. R. M. Wanamaker of Columbus, and a nephew of Mr. and Mrs. C. Garfield Snow of Mt. Vernon, was united in marriage Friday, Oct. 21, to Miss Isabel Fox of New York city. The bride is the daughter of Mrs. Elizabeth Fox of Portland, Ore.

Both Wanamaker and his bride saw service overseas during the world war. Wanamaker was in the air service. He was shot down over the German lines on July 2, 1918, and was held prisoner for five months, spending most of his time in prison hospitals. He was returned by the Germans to Allery, France, on Dec. 1, 1918, where he met Miss Fox, who was private secretary to Col. L. L. Law.
