<h3>Several Charges Against The Defendant</h3>	<p>Gambier, Sept. 19—Outnumbered, outweighed and outgeneraled, the Sophomores went down to defeat at the hands of the Freshmen in the annual cane rush at Kenyon college this noon. When the pile was finally cleared, 15 Freshmen hands were clutching the historic cane, while only 5 Sophomores succeeded in getting one hand apiece on the wood. Judges R. L. Matthews and Eric M. Tasman accordingly declared the victory the Freshmen's which entitles the class to carry canes the first Sunday after Easter and escort the seniors to chapel at that time.</p> <p>The Freshmen were taken out by members of the Junior class Friday evening to a barn on the Reason Baker farm, one mile and a half south-west of Gambier and were there sequestered. After ten o'clock, the Sophomores were allowed free rein in the search for the underclassmen. After scouting around for two hours and one half, they were finally located and a pitch battle ensued until 4 o'clock Saturday morning, at which time, twenty sophomores had been tied up by the Freshmen and six Freshmen by the sophomores. Five of the captured Sophomores were let go on protest that outsiders had aided the Freshmen in the capture.</p> <p>Thus, when the two classes lined up against each other Saturday noon, after President William F. Peirce had delivered the cane to the Freshman rush leader, Pogue of Cincinnati, with a brief history of it, the Freshmen outnumbered the Sophomores by twenty men. The Sophomores were under the leadership of Ralph J. Doll of Canton and rushed immediately toward the wedge-shaped body of Freshmen as soon as the starting whistle was blown.
