1-Sec. of State Henry Kissinger and North Vietnamese Politburo member Le Duc Tho were awarded the 1973 Nobel Peace Prize Tues. for their efforts to officially end the Vietnam War.

2-Pres. Anwar Sadat of Egypt claimed today his troops have missiles poised "to be launched to the very depths of Israel any minute. If you imagine you can hit at Arab depth," Sadat declared in reference to Israeli leaders, "I want to warn you that the transdesert Egyptian missiles of the Zafer type are now fitted on their bases."

3-Yesterday Premier Golda Meir of Israel told the Israeli parliament, "At this very moment Israeli forces are on the western bank of the canal." She did not say how many Israelis were on the western side of the Canal, or where they had crossed.
