He has also cancelled the agreement made earlier with the Senate Watergate Committee which would have provided the committee with at least summaries of various taped conversations.
- 2-Yesterday the House of Representatives "undertook to inquire into the impeachment of the President of the United States."
- 3-The presentation of impeachment resolutions should not hold up confirmation hearings on the appointment of Gerald Ford as the new Vice-President.
- 4-The U.S.S.R. warned Israel yesterday that "the gravest consequences will result" if Israel does not return to Monday's cease fire lines. Israel has apparently taken the offensive after Egyptian cease-fire violations.
