NEWS:

1) In a televised speech last night, President Nixon outlined the plan, proposed by the Energy Emergency Action Group, which the United States will follow in order to cope with the energy crisis. Briefly, the plan involves four points:

1)Some of the petroleum which normally would be used for the manufacture of gasoline

must be used for the manufacture of heating oil.

2)All gasoline stations will be required to close from 9:00 p.m. Saturday until

midnight Sunday every weekend, beginning December 1.

3)A maximum speed limit of 50 m.p.h. will be established for automobiles as soon as emergency legislation can pass. Maximum speed limit will be 55 m.p.h. for innercity buses and for trucks.

4) There is to be a curtailment of ornamental and unnecessary lighting.

There also will be a reduction in the amount of heating oil allowed. (A report on this will be issued on Tuesday.) The reduction will be approximately as follows: 10% reduction for industry; 15% reduction for homes; 25% reduction for businesses. It is asked that indoor temperature for homes be maintained at 68 degrees.

2)Yesterday, the Greek Army overthrew the Government of former Premier George Papadapolous. The coup occurred 8 days after a large-scale student demonstration in Athens.
