1-Rosemary Woods, Pres. Nixon's secretary, testified again yesterday concerning her accidental erasure of 18 minutes from one of the subpoenaed "Watergate tapes".

2-Questions have again arisen concerning Nixon's prior knowledge of Watergate (before the Spring of this year). A tape in the custody of the courts reveals a conversation held between Nixon and Haldeman three days after Watergate. Such statements as, "We should be on the attack-for diversion." and reference to a counter attack to focus on Democratic wrongdoings have aroused the suspicions of legal investigators and Congressmen alike.

3-United Airlines has announced that 8% of its flights (100) will be cancelled in January. 650 Attendants will be laid off, and 300 pilots will be put on furlough. Up to 200 more cancellations may also be made in the near future. This action is taken in reaction to the present Energy Crisis.
