- 1) The Symbionese Liberation Army, abductors of newspaper executive Randolph A. Hearst's daughter, Patricia, are, for the present, remaining silent. Efforts are being made to make the next food distribution, scheduled for this week, more orderly than the first one, which was disrupted by rioting.
- 2) Reg Murphy, recently abducted editor of the Atlanta Constitution newspaper, has been released. The ransom has been recovered from Murphy's abductor, William Williams. The FBI is still attempting to determine whether or not there really is an American Revolutionary Army, or if Williams acted on his own in the kidnapping.
- 3) Exiled Russian author Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn has gone to Norway. The author likes the country, and it is thought that he will settle there. Solzhenitsyn reportedly has several unpublished volumes of his history of Soviet repression, The Gulag Archipelago. It is reported that the books will be published.
- 4) Every morning, motorists in Scarsdale, N.Y. line up outside the home of Mrs. Mary Kerm while they are waiting to buy gasoline at a nearby station.
