THE Chio Athletic Conference, of which Kenyon is a member, in a special July session voted to to remove the word "male" from the General Regulations. A committee which includes representatives of women's sports programs in CAC colleges was formed to study the ramifications of this action. This committee is scheduled to report at the November meeting of the CAC. The new ruling allows women to compete on men's teams immediately until further guidelines are established. Title IX regulations of the federal government exempt the sports of football and wrestling from this change.
