Charles Pettit Mcllvaine

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Cinc. Feb. 18, 1823

Dear Bishop-

As to Clements, no body has mentioned him to me, but Brown
 His suggestion was the only cause of
 mine - He also mentioned that
 Clements had said to him that
 under present circumstances (I suppose
 Lang's & Chapman's supposed habits
 the cause) he could not recom-
 -mend a parent to send a
 son to the College - That is pretty
 serious in the Educational Agent's
 about Staff. I suppose he might
 be troublesome - I will inquire how
 as to that point - Osborn would

The best of all & I am pretty
sure would go - The difficulty then
is the salary he would need - at
least \$1000 - Now I think the
work of the agency does not require
a whole man - & if we could
get it well done otherwise, it
would be better -

I wrote Andrews about assist-
ants - & he consulted Mr Jarvis
one of the Committee & Judge
Lucas & they all agree upon
Nato - Weeks - Still engaging in
Nato - would be well -

I thought I had remembered
that Dr. Howe had formerly written
me his declination - I suppose
the reason why I did not
think of doing so, was that it

was so certain at any rate
If the Prospect was published only
in the paper - I will thank you
to get me three copies of the
paper & have them sent me -
