Mr Allen.

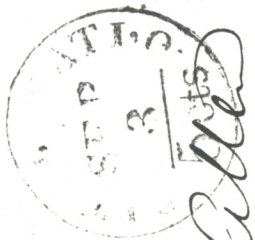
