My very Dear Lord.

1824.

On my arrival

in town this day at 11  
I found your Lordship's kind  
letter, with all the inclosures  
sent me at Oxford for Thursday  
and Friday. The Post man though  
he had sent me letters yet quite  
neglected me.

I came off on Saturday morn-  
ing after a most agreeable visit  
to your Alma Mater. The reason  
because of the merry civilities  
manifested towards myself and a  
bowe all of the great interest taken

in the cause of Ohio, <sup>by the University of Oxford</sup> will, I trust, never leave my conscious mind.

Since returning to town I have had much conversation with those best of friends the Marquis respecting my speedy return to Ohio. Mr. Wiggins & Lord Gambia is against it. They say my work will be but half done; & that duty shoud prompt me to ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> ~~work~~ <sup>work</sup> ~~men~~ <sup>men</sup> the work demands that I persevere in it to the final accomplishment — but I have not time to enter on this question now —

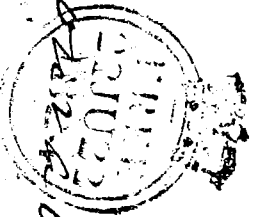
