This will not (as stated in your Ltr  
in closed paper) bring me in the ordinary  
my course of Gods Providence to New York

departure of my family and in visit-  
ing my brothers in N. Hampshire &  
Vermont (if them I can visit at all)

The month of Sep<sup>r</sup> is the only  
month with a part of Oct<sup>r</sup> in which  
a family like mine can move  
600 miles as from New York to Ohio.

 can not go at all. & if I go not this  
 winter One whole year will be lost.

Against this hasty departure there

 forth by the powerful influence of
