Columnist Jack Anderson filed a \$22 million damage suit against Nixon and 19 of his subordinates, accusing them of conducting a 5-year campaign to destroy Anderson's credibility.

Failure by the NAACP to raise \$1.6 million by the end of the week will "have the effect of bankruptcy" on the civil rights organization. The money is needed for a bond in Mississippi.
