Hurricane Liza hit La Paz, Mexico on Friday. Winds up to 130 mph killed between 630 and 1,000 people, while 14,000 were injured and 70,000 were left homeless. If public controversy continues, President Ford may ask Secretary of Agriculture Earl Butz to resign due to racist remarks revealed in the New York Times. The Supreme Court will consider a re-evaluation of suspects' rights, subsidized abortions, and the constitutionality of the death penalty for rape in the term opening today.
