

IN THE NEWS

Three Americans were named for the 1976 Nobel Prizes in Medicine and Economics. The medicine prize was awarded to Prof. Baruch S. Blumberg and Prof. D. Carleton Gajdusek. Milton Friedman was awarded the economics prize.

Special Prosecutor Ruff released a report concerning his investigation into the alleged illegal dealings of President Ford during his Congressional campaign. Ruff stated that there is no evidence of any illegal dealings and that the investigation is closed.

Dame Edith Evans died today in England at eighty-eight years of age.

Dr. Cooper of the Federal Health Administration assured the American people that the swine flu inoculations are safe and that the deaths reported were of other causes. The states that had halted inoculations have resumed their programs.

Energy Conservationists asked both Presidential candidates to consider forming a Federal Energy Company to provide competition for the private companies. The Energy Board reported that this competition would bring down the unreasonably high prices.
