You shall now have a few words from us. We are all well here in Denmark, and the life is going on nearly as usual.

Now the days are being shorter, the dark streets appear a little uncomfortable, but we know to arrange us to the new situation, seing forward to brighter days.

We have cards for sugar, coffee and tea, but this cards are old acquaintance from the last war.

Now the danish crops are nearly in house. The weather has not been as good as wished for, but the crop is near the average, and for potatoes and turnips even very good.

Until now we have had enough of food, and there is no doubt that we shall have enough to come through the winter, even if it is clear, that we cannot live as usual.

To Mabel we send our best wishes for the birthday, but we do not know whether this letter reach you this day.

To George I send a new danish block of stamps just issued today. I also stamp the letter with this block.

Please let us hear from you when you have received this letter.
