

IN THE NEWS

A giant floating crane righted the Mississippi River ferry that capsized after a collision that left up to 82 river commuters dead. Eighteen persons survived the crash.

There was a large crowd at the General Dynamics plant in Fort Worth, Texas to see the new F-16 fighter aircraft rolled out Wednesday. Among the witnesses at the rollout were government and military officials from the U.S. and other European countries which will co-produce the new NATO fighter.

Government regulators of natural gas are reducing by \$580 million the natural gas price hikes they approved because of prospects that consumers were going to face larger increases than the government intended.

Greek Premier Constantine Caramanlis strongly reaffirmed his country's ties to the west.

Twenty-four pesticides made by 12 companies are being studied by the Environmental Protection Agency to determine whether they contain nitrosamines, which are suspected of causing cancer.
