Today is Veteran's Day.

Indians in Maine may own 2/3 of the State—and Federal courts have ordered the Federal government to sue the State on behalf of the Indians. The State sold the land in violation of a Federal law passed in 1790.

The Lebanese cease-fire was threatened by continued fighting in the southern part of the country between Israeli-armed Christians and Palestinian and Lebanese Moslems.

The Irish government began a search for a new President following the sudden resignation of Cearbhall O'Dalaigh after only 22 months in office.
