IN THE NEWS

New black demands and a claim by Prime Minister Ian Smith that the white minority in Rhodesia can hold onto power for years have widened the gulf between the two sides and dimmed the outlook for impending talks to arrange majority rule for Rhodesia.

The Arab summit meeting was scheduled to give its formal approval yesterday to the Riyadh peace plan for Lebanon despite Iraqi objections(to the bulk of the force being Syrian).

Twenty-two youths were arrested in Boston during a one-day antibussing school boycott that included two attempted fire-bombings of integrated schools.

Most of the 'sewer gang' that pulled off the \$8-10 million "robbery of the century" in Nice was arrested early yesterday in coordinated raids across France. The money is still missing.
