A coroner says that the captain of a Mississippi River commuter ferry was 'almost legally drunk' when his craft collided with a tanker last week, killing an estimated 78 persons. Leftist Beirut newspapers reported yesterday that the Syrian government has given the green light to Palestinian guerillas to move reinforcements into southern areas bordering Israel. President Ford is making final preparations to announce his long-awaited proposals to control the spread of nuclear technology and weapons. Minority enrollment in the nation's colleges and universities rose 11.7% between 1972-4, with major strides in private colleges and universities. General Motors chalked up record thirdquarter sales and profits with an unexpectedly strong showing that demonstrated the auto industry's rebound this year from bust to boom.
