William E. Schaufele Jr., U.S. under Secretary of State, arrived in Geneva this weekend to join behind-the-scenes talks at the Geneva conference on Rhodesia, where black nationalist leaders have adopted opposing positions on proposals drawn up by Kissinger.

A sudden, 11th hour swing by independent voters has helped President Ford make the most spectacular political comeback in decades. Closing in a dead heat, this campaign is too close to predict the winner.
