IN THE NEWS

Two strong aftershocks leveled the remaining buildings in Muradiye, Turkey. 3,636 bodies have already been recovered and it is feared the toll may reach 5,000. The U.S. has already made 25 cargo planes available to bring in supplies donated by NATO.

The report on November employment, which will be released by the Labor Department on Friday, could show unemployment up above 8 per cent, the highest it has been since last December.

Leftist and middle-road political forces made plans to organize opposition to next month's referendum on parliamentary reform in Spain.

Britain and the African "frontline" states have agreed to back the appointment of nationalist leader Joshua Nkomo as Prime Minister of Rhodesia's interim government, a move that could lead to war.

AROUND THE TOWN

IN COLUMBUS:

GERMAN VILLAGE is bounded by Linvingston Ave., Pearl St., Nursery Lane, Blackberry Alley and Grant St. It is easily reached by exit 100B off I-70 and I-71 southbound and is about one mile south of the city center. It was settled in 1840 to 1860 by German settlers who built solid brick homes. St. Mary Church, on S. 3rd St. was begun in 1866 and is of Gothic design. Many of the homes have been restored to their original state. Several sausage houses and other establishments provide regional food. At Christmas a house decoration contest is held.

COLUMBUS GALLERY OF FINE ARTS, E. Broad St. at Washington Ave., includes the works of George Bellows, a native of Columbus. Open daily noon - 5:00 pm; closed major holidays. Free. FRANKLIN PARK CONSERVATORY is in Franklin Park at E. Broad St. and Nelson Rd. The glass

building was a feature of the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. Tropical and subtropical plants

are grown here; seasonal shows. Daily 9-5; closed holidays. Free.

OHIO VILLAGE, just north of the junction of I-71 and 17th Ave. Recreated Village represents typical Ohio community of early 19th century. Visitors can observe craftsmen practicing their trade - blacksmith, tinsmith, printer, weaver, cabinetmaker, etc. Contains early Ohio museum, town hall, hotel and town square. Closed Mon. and Tues. Open Wed. thru Sun. 10-6.
