There is finally some progress in the talks to bring black rule to Rhodesia. After weeks of unsuccessful meetings there are now concrete proposals under consideration. The British government offered to aid Rhodesia in the transition of power. This is a turn-about from the former British position.

In Detroit, the backlog of cases and the general inefficiency of the court system has drawn much attention. One system proposed to rectify the situation includes opening 60 new courts and having judges work an eight hour day.

When Carter was campaigning he stated that he would choose his own Director of the FBI if elected. Yesterday the present Director, Kelly, told newsmen that he would not step down.

Four days of snow closed schools, offices, and industry in Buffalo, New York yesterday. In other areas of the country temperatures fell to below -30°F.

Lack of confidence in the economic plans of the incoming administration sent prices on the stock market down once again.
