IN THE NEWS

President-elect Carter has begun a series of interviews of prospective Cabinet members. Although the interviews are going well, Carter does not expect to make any announcements until at least the end of the week.

- The US Supreme Court voted 6-3 yesterday deciding that the exclusion of pregnancy from a sickness plan was not discrimination. Their reasoning was that the sickness plan is no more than an insurance plan with certain options chosen by the firm. Many women hearing the decision plan to continue their efforts along different lines to make pregnancy a mandatory part of every sickness plan.
- In Pearl Harbor last night there was the 35th Annual Recognition of the Japanese Attack. The survivers of the attack hosted this event with many students, military officers and dignitaries in attendance.
- The California Supreme Court voted that the State's capital punishment law is unconstitutional because it contains no plan for mitigating circumstances. There are presently 65 men and 2 women on Death Row in California.
