In the News

US oil companies and foreign countries will be asked by the Federal Energy Administration early next year to bid competitively to supply oil for the nation's stockpile program.

Americans missing in action in Indochina must be considered dead, a House committee stated.

It said that Vietnam and Cambodia can't be expected to provide a full account of more than 750 men listed as MIA. One comment on the statement from an MIA organization was "ludicrous!

More than 15,000 Vietnamese have committed suicide because of the harshness of the Communist rule, according to a Canadian priest who was expelled after 19 years in Vietnam.

Spanish voters approved a plan for democracy including a two-house parliament. This new plan would replace the 36-year rule of Francisco Franco. The turnout was about 75%.

Rules banning flurocarbon gases in "nonessential" uses will be issued in about a year, according to a report to the Senate from a subcommittee of government regulators.

Helmut Schmidt was narrowly reelected chancellor by West Germany's parliament.

Japanese Premier Takeo Miki said that he will announce his resignation today to take the

responsibility for his party's setback at the polls ten days ago.
