In the News

- The U.S. Supreme Court will receive the constitutionality of Ohio's latest Parochial law that gives \$88.8 million in materials over the next two years to parochial schools. The American Civil Liberties Union charges that this law violates the First Amendment separation of church and state.
- Attorney General William J. Brown charged two Columbus podiatrists, their surgical service firm, and three area pharmacies with Medicaid fraud. Suit has been filed against Dr. Norman Carter and Dr. Barry Cohen for overcharging Ohio's Medicaid program \$60,000 in conjunction with three branches of Lynn Drugstores.
- A winter storm bringing high winds, snow, and ice to the East coast was also blamed for the sinking of an empty U.S. oil tanker off of Cape Ann, Massachusetts. One seaman is missing and six were rescued. This is the thirteenth accident involving a tanker in U.S. waters in the last month.
