Pres. Ford sent Congress a proposal for the Aviation Act of 1977. It would ease federal controls on routes and fares, subsidize flights with too few passengers, and support commercial service.

President elect Carter phoned leaders of Britain, France, and West Germany in between briefs on arms limitation and defense. Carter and the British Prime Minister agreed on a visit by Callaghan to Washington, but set no date.

One third of the members of the Senate have sent a letter to the French Ambassador in Washington protesting the French government's release of the Arab terrorist believed to have masterminded the 1972 Munich Olympics massacre.

A jury in Oakland, Calif. has begun deliberating the explosives possession trial of Wendy Yoshimura, Patricia Hearst's underground companion.
