In Phoenix, Arizona a man accused of killing newsman Don Bolles pleaded guilty to a reduced charge of second-degree murder on Saturday. John Harvey Adamson admitted to the judge that he placed a bomb under Bolles' car in a hotel parking lot.

US Senators John Glenn and Harrison A. Williams Jr. are among those making yet another try at reuniting ailing Anatol Michelson with the wife and daughter he left behind when he fled Russia in 1956. The Soviet-forced separation is the longest recorded in State Department records.

Death penalty opponents turned to prayer and protest Saturday as convicted killer Gary Mark Gilmore awaited execution to be held at sunrise this morning by a five-man firing squad.

The US Parole Commission will conduct hearings in Washington January 25 and 27 on the parole application of Watergate burglar E. Howard Hunt. Hunt will plead his own case.

A white collar crime ring was smashed by a fake police fencing operation that recovered \$16.4 million in stolen merchandise in Norfolk, Virginia, a spokesman for the FBI reported.
