## In the News

Indiana has become the 35th state to ratify Equal Rights Amendment. Three more states are needed before the amendment will be added to the Constitution.
President Ford asked Congress to approve the defense agreement with Turkey that was arranged last March. The agreement will give Turkey \$1 billion.
Defense Secretary Rumsfeld said that the U.S. should increase defense spending in the next three years to maintain a superior position over the U.S.S.R..
President Ford presented the report of the Council of Economic Advisors to Congress yesterday. The report stated that although unemployment remained too high, it should go down to 7% by the end of 1977. Also, inflation decreased and the U.S. is more dependent on foreign oil than it previously has been.
