### TIMELINE OF THE DESCENT OF THE ROYAL GIFT THROUGH THE MOSLEY FAMILY

Sir Nicholas Mosley c.1527-1612 Alderman Aldersgate 1589, Langbourne 1594

Sheriff of London 1591

Bought the Manor of Manchester 1596

Buys Hough End and starts building hall

Lord Mayor of London Sept 1599-Sept 1600

Knighted by the Queen, gifted bed 1600

Rowland Mosley d. 1616 Son. Bought Withington for £8000 1598

Sir Edward Mosley 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet 1616-1657 Son. Made 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Rolleston 1640

In addition to Hough End and the Manor

he also inherits Rolleston Hall from his uncle

Sir Edward Mosley of Gray's Inn, barrister

Sir Edward Mosley 2<sup>nd</sup> Baronet c.1638-1665 Son. Has Hough End and the Manor and

Rolleston. In addition buys Hulme Hall 1661

Leaves Rolleston to cousin Oswald (Snr.),

of Ancoats Hall (grandson of Sir Nicholas'

brother Anthonie) after death of his wife.

2<sup>nd</sup> son of Oswald Snr. of Ancoats (whose son

Oswald gets Ancoats); Edward gets Hough

End, the Manor and Hulme.

Litigation. Life interest in Manor & houses to

daughter Anne who marries Sir John Bland

Daughter. Lives at Hulme & Kippax Park

Yorks., but still owns Hough End & life

interest in Manchester. These latter managed

by cousin Oswald (Tory, closet Jacobite).

Son. Twice MP for Lancashire. Jacobite.

Manchester goes to Oswald of Ancoats 1734.

The gifted bed presumably taken there from Hough

End 1734, then transferred to Rolleston before

Ancoats let; alternatively importance not realised

until heirloom furniture & pieces rediscovered by

Oswald Mosley 2<sup>nd</sup> Bt. in early C19th

Sir Oswald Mosley 2<sup>nd</sup> Bt 1705-1757

Rev Sir John Mosley 3<sup>rd</sup> Bt 1722-1779

John Parker Mosley 1<sup>st</sup> Bt 1732-1798 Cousin of the Ancoats branch. Made 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet

Mosley of Ancoats 1781. Lets Ancoats Hall however

after a massive family party and lives at Rolleston.

Sir Oswald Mosley 2 <sup>nd</sup> Bt	1785-1871	Grandson. Owns Ancoats & Rolleston. Writes
		Family Memoirs; sells Manchester for £200,000
		in 1846. Recovers lost pieces of family heirlooms.
Sir Tonman Mosley 3 <sup>rd</sup> Bt	1813-1890	<sup>2 nd</sup> son (elder brother Oswald died)
Sir Oswald Mosley 4 <sup>th</sup> Bt	1848-1915	Son. Helps rescue furniture in 1871 Rolleston fire.
		Shows royal gift to visitors. Makes
		settlement 1906 directing family heirlooms
		down line of 2 nd son.
Sir Tonman Mosley,	1850-1933	Next brother. Made Lord Anslow of Iver 1916.
Hildred Mosley	1887-1963	Eldest daughter (two sons died in 1WW).
