In the News

A gas explosion at the University of Pittsburgh killed two people and injured 45. There is still a possibility of finding more bodies as search teams investigate the rubble.

There is now a calm in Egypt after two days of rioting that left 55 people dead and another 700 wounded. The riots over the rapid rise in food prices caused severe damage in the city

The Coast Guard is still looking for survivors after the wreck of a freighter that sank Thursday after breaking in half.

Two teams of San Francisco police rescued a man held for 72 hours. In total four men were arrested for the abduction of this man with a \$400,000 ransom.

Terrorist fighting broke out in Mexico City yesterday killing two engineers and one American. Guerrillas began rioting after being prohibited from distributing pamphlets.

In New York a judge passed a ruling that men cannot be exempt from alimony payments. It is predicted that it will take two to three years before coffee production reaches an adequate level. General Foods announced a new price hike to \$3.11 per pound.
