In the News

Gov. Rhodes and state legislative leaders continued work yesterday on statewide energy emergency plans in view of what is described as a "frightening" report from Ohio's major gas utilities.

Young, ambassador-designate to the UN, will attend a conference of 14 African nations. Mondale began his trip to Europe and Japan yesterday to familiarize US allies with the Carter administration and consult with them on international economic problems.

A locomotive went out of control Saturday on a passenger train descending into Bolivia's Central Valley, causing the deaths of 19 persons and injuries to at least 30 others. Winter damage to Florida's citrus crop promises higher supermarket prices for consumers. The exact amount of damage still is under investigation but it is estimated that 35 to

50 percent of the crops were lost with the freeze.
