In the News

President Carter called his Cabinet into session over the energy shortage Saturday and said he might ask industries to go on a four-day work week to conserve fuel.

Freddie Prinze, star of television's "Chico and the Man", died Saturday after doctors fought for 33 hours to save the life he decided to take in a fit of despair.

The Rev. David Stanley, a Roman Catholic priest has resigned from Pope Paul VI's top panel of Bible experts with protest against the pontiff's new edict barring women from the priesthood.

In Rome, a parliamentary commission indicted two former defense ministers on corruption charges in Italy's Lockheed scandal Saturday but former Premier Mariano Rumor escaped indictment.

Twelve bomb explosions rocked London Saturday, and a man claiming to represent the Irish Republican Army (IRA) said the IRA was responsible.


