## In the News

State energy officials received several calls Saturday in response to advertisements placed in eight newspapers in the Southwest seeking additional natural gas for Ohio consumers from independent gas producers. The ads will continue to run into the first part of this week. Meanwhile Gov. Rhodes said that Ohio's natural gas crisis is far from over and Ohioans must continue to conserve fuel.

In Chicago, city transit officials blamed a 34 year old motorman Saturday for a rush-hour elevated collision that killed 11 persons and left 200 injured.

United Auto Workers members went on strike against Rockwell International in Ohio and five other states Saturday after their three-year contract expired shortly before midnight, Fri. Saturday night Ronald Reagan called for a "New Republican Party", rebuilt on conservative principles and shed of the country club image. His speech was the first comprehensive presentation of his blueprint for the conservative future.
