In the News

The President chose Stansfield Turner, a former classmate at the Naval Academy, for the dual job of Director of Central Intelligence and Head of the CIA. Carter retained Jack Eckherd as head of the General Services Administration.

Rhodesian guerrillas killed seven white Catholic missionaries in a mission outside Salisbury. One priest was not massacred and reported the horror to the London sponsors of the mission. General Motors' fourth quarter earnings jumped 29% to \$797 million, while a full-year net more than doubled to a record \$2.9 million.

US Secretary-General Waldheim flew to Beirut to meet with Lebanese leaders about a possible Middle East Peace conference.

Two Soviet cosmonauts were launched into orbit and will try to link their Soyuz spaceship with a lab already in orbit. A similar attempt failed in October.

A US-Soviet dispute over grain shipping has been largely resolved.
