Young, just back from a ten day visit to Africa, reported that all the problems are not in South Africa. Young feels that we have a few handles on those conflicts but we have no understanding of the serious tensions in the north, especially between Ethiopia and her neighbors. He suggested that the U.S. should look into these problems and counter Russian overtures there.
