Trudeau speaking to a joint session of Congress, said Canada will remain together. President Carter wants to increase spending \$19.5 billion, raising total spending to \$459 billion. Funds will be transferred from weapons development to the areas of Social Security, the development of the electric car, aid to the Middle East, transit, highways, railroads, and state and local funding.


